Pay dues the easy way - online

Dues for next year are due by July 1. You can send a check to our treasurer, but it's easier for you and her if you pay online. (Of the \$86 total, \$59 goes to AAUW National. \$12 to the state, and \$15 to our branch.)

Use your AAUW member id and password to access the Member Services Database and your contact information. Click on *Renew my membership* on the left. Follow the instructions to pay securely by credit card.

Students, Tech Trek benefit from fund raising

It's been a good year. Our Charitable Foundation board will distribute almost \$6,000 from this year's fund raising as well as the \$2,500 scholarship donated by Friends of the Northern Palm Beach Library. Here's a summary:

• Local Doris Karlik Scholarships. We had enough to award three \$1,000 scholarships this year. In addition, a \$500 grant was made from scholarship money reserved from prior years. (See page 1 for the names of the winners.)

• **Tech Trek.** Florida Tech Trek will receive \$1,500 from this year's fund raising.

• Honoree. The board reserved \$500 for our annual Educational Fund Honoree, which recognizes a member for outstanding contributions to the branch. A \$500 donation will be made in her name to one of the national AAUW Funds. The specific fund is still to be determined.

• NCWWSL. An additional \$155 was designated to reimburse Paulina Oporto Cespedes for airfare to attend the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders, May 30 to June 9, at the University of Maryland. • AAUW Fund. \$500 will go to the national AAUW Fund as designated by attendees at our benefit luncheon. An additional \$206 will go to the AAUW Fund's Legal Advocacy Fund, which offers case support funding for those challenging gender discrimination or harassment in the workplace or in education.

• Friends of Northern Palm Beach Library. We've selected a winner for this scholarship, which we administer, and will coordinate the award to the recipient with the library.

Other distributions

In addition, last year, the foundation donated \$2,100 to Florida Tech Trek through the AAUW Fund before national required states to take over management of the program. This January, we made another donation of \$900 to Tech Trek, comprising members' donations, but not from our fund raiser.

The board also reserved funds to pay for our scholarship winners' dinners at the May 14 installation of officers, as is our practice.

In addition, reserves of at least \$500 have been set aside to make a deposit for the venue for next year's fund raiser. ◆

Don't miss deadlines for state, national bylaws votes

As a branch member, you're also a member of both the state and national AAUW organizations and have a say in their operations and activities. Both organizations are proposing changes that you can weigh in on. And both use the email and postal addresses recorded in national's Membership Services Database to contact you about voting. It's a good idea to check your profile at www.aauw.org/login to make sure it's correct. Information on issues and deadlines for each ballot follows.

Vote on dropping degree requirement ends June 9

proposing three changes to the bylaws that they believe are needed to make AAUW more effective:

Should AAUW membership be open to those who don't have a degree but who support the organization's mission?

Should the national board of directors include those who are not members of AAUW?

Should three-year staggered terms be created for service on the national board of directors?

Voting opened April 25 and will close June 9 at 9 p.m. ET. You're encouraged to vote online using your member ID and PIN (which

The two proposals about board service are seen as best practices bringing AAUW in line with other nonprofits.

The more wide-reaching proposal to drop the degree requirement has come up for a vote before and did not pass. So members must again decide on what would be a major shift in AAUW.

The board believes dropping the degree requirement would align better with our mission; bring in more members; increase our impact; enhance diversity; and make it easier to get grants. ♦

State public policies' vote starts May 15, ends June 15

The AAUW Florida board is asking for approval of two proposals:

Public policy priorities. Florida's public policy priorities are due for approval this year, and, again, you're asked to adopt the public policy priorities that national has identified to inform advocacy efforts for the next two years.

Broadly, the priorities:

• Support a strong system of public education that promotes gender fairness, equity, and diversities.

· Achieve economic self-sufficiency for all women.

 Guarantee equality, individual rights, and social justice for a diverse society

Pay equity resolution. You're also asked to approve the sending of an official thanks to legislator Lori Berman and her assistant Abby Ross for work on legislation aimed at pay equity for women.

Dates, deadlines. You're eligible to vote if you've been a member of AAUW Florida as of March 15, 2018. You'll get instructions and ballots by email based on vour contact information in the Member Services Database. If you don't have email, you'll receive a paper ballot.

Online voting begins May 15 and ends June 15 at 9 p.m. EDT. Paper ballots must be postmarked by 11:59 p.m., EDT, June 13. Voting results will be announced in an email to branch presidents and on our state website.
