Every year, AAUW Florida schedules a Lobby Day for branch members to meet with legislators while they're in session. The idea is to let lawmakers know about and understand AAUW public policy priorities.

This year's Lobby Day was a virtual event, held Jan. 18 at the beginning of the session. But you still have until March 11 to do your own lobbying while the session is ongoing.

By contacting legislators, during the session or other times, you'll give AAUW FL a strong display of support and help to advance policies that make a difference in the lives of women and their families.

Legislative priorities

Your support is needed on AAUW Florida's 2022 legislative priorities. Read the <u>full policy agenda</u> on AAUW Florida's website. Highlights are below:

- Support fair pay for all.
- Ensure diversity in state government programs and activities.

- Support the effort to stop human trafficking.
- Support reproductive rights.
- Establish the commissioner of education as an elected role.
- Oppose the removal of the critical race theory in public institutions.
- Oppose the disenfranchisement of no-party affiliation voters in school board elections.

Power of Story is convention theme

Join AAUW Florida for this year's biennial convention and annual meeting, The Power of Story, held virtually April 1-3.

Michael Butler, Ph.D., the Kenan Distinguished Professor of History at Flagler College in St.

Augustine, kicks off the convention at 5 p.m. Friday, April 1, with "Myth, Memory, and the Power of Story," about the Lost Cause myth of the Confederacy and how it has been perpetuated.

Speakers Saturday morning include Mary Hickey, AAUW Senior Director of Communications, on "Telling the AAUW Story" at 10 a.m., and

Natalie Underberg-Goode, Ph.D., communication and media professor, University of Central Florida on "The Stories We Tell: Personal Narratives, Organizational Tales, Digital Storytelling."

At 10 a.m. Sunday, Mary Gatta, Ph.D., research director for the National Association of Colleges and Employers, describes "The Power of Story in Qualitative Research."

The annual meeting and election are at 11 a.m. A town hall with Mary Hickey follows.

Requirements:

- 1. Resident of Palm Beach County, FL
- 2. US Citizen, by birth or naturalization
- 3. Attending or planning to attend an accredited Florida college, university, or trade school.
- 4. 3.0 grade point average or higher (For high school seniors your high school GPA. For college students, your college GPA only)
- 5. A completed application form including personal statements
- 6. An unofficial college (or high school if you are a high school senior) transcript


