Spring Fling BENEFIT LUNCHEON



Mayor Reed is a true inspiration. At a time of increasingly rapid growth in Palm Beach Gardens, it was reassuring to hear her assert a commitment to maintaining the wonderful quality of life that Palm Beach Gardens residents enjoy. Luncheon attendees were riveted as she told personal anecdotes of her difficult upbringing and the teachers who inspired her along the way.
